The Presbytery of Missouri River Valley (southeast NE and southwest IA) is part of the Synod of Lakes and Prairies. The synod encompasses MN, IA, NE, ND, WI, and SD. The Synod has just wrapped up Synod School. It is a week-long event held at Buena Vista College in Storm Lake, IA. This year it was a hybrid being available virtually and in-person. I want to share an article about the first night.

Synod School preacher: God chose us through Christ before laying the foundation of the world

LOUISVILLE — Growing up in the City of New York, the Rev. Samuel Son, Presbyterian Mission Agency's manager for Diversity and Reconciliation, said he remembers pretending that he didn't care how early in the process he was selected to play in a pickup baseball game. "We would stand there, trying to look like we didn't care," Son recalled during evening worship Monday at the <u>Synod of Lakes and Prairies</u>' <u>Synod School</u>. "But at the same time, we tried to stand out. We definitely didn't want to be the last kid [selected]."

Contrast that, the Presbyterian Mission Agency's manager for Diversity and Reconciliation told the 450 people or so gathered in person or online for Synod School this week, with how God selects the elect according to Ephesians 1:3-10: God "chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before [God] in love."

At his crucifixion, "the Chosen One experiences rejection so that we can experience being the elected of the Chosen One," Son said. "It's an amazing love story. Before the foundation of the world, before any expansion of space and time, God had us in God's mind. It seems too good to be true."

Son likened that view to how he and his wife prepared for the arrival of their first child. "Before our first son was born, my wife and I were thinking about him and imagining our life together. We were planning. What should we name him? We even prepared a room. We wrote, 'Welcome home,' even though he didn't know how to read."

Election "is not about who goes to heaven and who doesn't," Son said. "It's about the God who saves us and knows us even before our first breath, even before the first atoms" came into being.

Notice the language in that part of Ephesians, Son said. Paul's word choices include "joy," "pleasure," "lavish" and "freely."

"This is what being chosen by God is," Son said. "God didn't create us because God needed people to work the garden. God chose us because God desired us."

Son urged his hearers to stop referring to Presbyterians as "God's frozen chosen."

"We've got to get rid of that term. There's no such thing as being frozen when you're chosen," Son said. "Emotion is a full-body experience. ... To be chosen, loved and desired by God — to be in Christ selected before the foundation of the world — you can't help but jump for joy and do mission work out of the lavishness of the love of God, which is flowing."

But many of our life experiences "say that we are not chosen. We have experienced so many hurts," Son said. "But Paul is so sure that he's saying to us, 'You were chosen before the foundation of the world.' What happens in the world doesn't change that fact."

Inviting worshipers to close their eyes for a moment, Son asked those gathered "to come before Jesus and just listen. He has been waiting to say this over and over, so hear what he's saying to you: 'Before you were born, child, I chose you. You are mine.'"

"Receive that," Son said. "'My child, I have chosen you before the foundation of the world. You are mine.""

Worshipers concluded the service by singing "Jesus Loves Me."

Pastor Meyer began his sermon. I had never before experienced the presence of the Lord like I did that morning. I don't remember ever hearing the scripture preached like that before. I do remember turning to Mike and saying, "You are not getting me out of this pew!"

And here we are, 33 years later...still in the pews of West Hills Church! This is where we raised our children, where Mike and I have grown on our spiritual journeys, and, as Mike would say, "... where our faith no longer was that of our parents but became our own." special programs at West Hills. Erika is leaving her position at West Hills as she plans on furthering her education starting this Fall. We asked Erika about her time as Nursery Coordinator and her answers below really helped us to appreciate even more how fortunate we were to have her at West Hills. **Thank you Erika for not only doing such a good job but having such a loving heart!**

1. Tell me about your time working in the nursery (how long/roles, etc).

I have had the pleasure to be working in the nursery for almost 17 years. I came in as a nursery staff member in 2004 and in 2015, I became the nursery coordinator. The timing of both of these things were completely God's timing. In 2015 I had just started to stay at home with my kids after leaving the classroom. My ultimate desire was to be home, but I really longed for more interaction with other kids and to use my education degree. At the time, Beth Nodes was moving into her full time social work role and so her nursery coordinator position was made available.

2. What made you interested in working with our youngest members? 3. What has been the most rewarding part of leading the nursery ministry?

My educational background is in teaching littles so that is where I really feel most at home. The innocence and wonder of their minds is incredibly fun for me. What a gift it is to be one of the first adult leaders to speak God's love into them. This would have to be one of the most rewarding parts of leading the nursery ministry.

3. We understand that you have an exciting new chapter beginning in your life. What is your next call in God's kingdom work?

I am beginning my graduate degree at UNO this fall and I'll be serving as a graduate assistant. I will be dual majoring in School Counseling and Clinical Counseling. I am very excited (and a little nervous) for this next adventure! I am not sure where God will lead me post graduation, but I am happy to be along for the ride.

4. How has your time leading the nursery helped you to discern this call?

My time in the nursery has definitely made me lean into what God has in store for me. When I first came on as a staff member and as a coordinator, it was just what I needed for my personal growth and for my family. I was able to experience young kids and their development as I was studying it in college, and then able to lead the nursery ministry while raising my own little "nursery" at home. It felt like "this is where I am supposed to be." If I could, I would stay rocking babies and greeting young families forever, but I know I am being called in different ways to minister.

5. As you look back over these seventeen years of ministry, what are you most proud of?

I think one of my proudest moments is when parents share stories of their child saying our nursery prayer before a meal. Some of these stories come from tiny littles who are barely making full sentences but they pick up that song! It is so genuine and sweet. I've always said my nursery mission is that our kids leave our space knowing that they are so loved by God. I am hopeful it sets a foundation for their faith. You are loved, you are loved, you are loved.

6. As you look back over these seventeen years of ministry, what is a memory or memories that make you smile?

I love when our nursery kids get to be apart of worship. I am sure some of you can remember the years our littles wore the lamb and donkey ears or held a baby doll while singing about baby Jesus. Heart melting!

7. Is there a story or memory that makes you laugh as you recall it?

I think of all the times we bring our nursery kids into the sanctuary and you just can't plan for what's to happen. There's no filter with 2 and 3 year olds. Will they stay on the stage? Sprint for mom in the back row? Cry out of nerves? One year when my oldest was two, he got up on stage and sang away and then screamed out "TOMAS!" in the middle of the song. We of course have it on video and every Christmas season we make sure to pull it up and watch his little hips sway, his hands clap and his shout singing.

Another year we had a sprinter in the middle of our Palm Sunday parade. Imagine me trying to quickly catch up with a FAST 3 year old while I am wearing heels...

8. What would you like to say to others about getting involved in the nursery ministry?

You're gonna love it! Prepare to get lots of hugs, maybe a little messy, and giggle a lot. You can come as you are and the kids will just be happy you're there. It is a pretty great feeling.

9. How can we be praying for you as you step into this new calling?

I would covet your prayers! Change is exciting and change is hard. Prayers for my transition into being a student again (it has been awhile!) and for my husband and kids as they have to shift a little for this to happen, too. I am so grateful to have my West Hills family praying for this journey!

WHC's FINANCE UPDATE by Mike Overby, Elder for Finance

Happy summer to all at WHC! It has come and will go all too quickly. Enjoy the remaining days. As we continue to press forward into the second half of the year I want to share with everyone where we stand from a financial perspective. We live in a world that now champions the belief in *'transparency'*. A Google search finds *'transparency'* implying "openness, communication and accountability". At its heart I find its meaning to be the sharing of information freely in an effort to benefit an organization and its people. With this as a background, below you'll find a brief summary from West Hill Church's Operating Fund for year to date results through July 31, 2O21:

Highlights and Observations

• In column 4 above, 2021's Annual Budget was approved as a 'balanced budget' with the inclusion of the benefit of a \$100,000 loan under the federal PPP program supporting COVID relief needs. This was a one-time grant (as the loan obligation has now been forgiven).

• Through July, the Budget essentially projected a breakeven condition for the WHC's operations (actually showing the (\$2,963) deficit as reflected in the first column).

• Our giving, as defined as "Pledged Revenue", now stands at a (\$27,328) shortfall.

• Operating Expenses are \$53,445 below the Budget. While this is favorable, it does reflect some timing delays in certain known expenses to be paid in the near term and does also reflect some changes and/or delays in planned expenses impacted/associated to COVID as we resume fully reopening church activities.

• YTD results show a (\$74,626) core operating deficit.

• AFTER factoring in the \$100,000 PPP Loan Forgiveness, a net operating surplus of \$25,374 is evident. This surplus is expected to be used over the next few months requiring use of funds from operating cash reserves.

• Historical giving, and as budgeted again for 2O21, resides in the month of December to reach our budgeted break even projection.

So, first let me **Thank You** all for your faithful giving thus far this year. Stewardship challenges us to use, maintain and give from the gifts God has blessed each of us. Prayerfully consider your giving over the remainder of the year. Putting our trust in God to provide moves us beyond those challenges and enables the work ahead to be accomplished. As a reminder, the YTD recap of our giving relative to our stewardship driven budget and in comparison to the prior YTD results is shared in the first Thursday Thoughts of each month. 2020/2021 WEST HILLS MISSION UPDATES by Mission Team Members

Covid changed how mission looked - but it didn't change the mission!

Here are highlights from some of our partners over the past 1 1/2 years. God's power and grace were abundant!! More next month from our other partners!

International Partners:

410 Bridge Haiti

Our continued support in Haiti helped tremendously with Covid related food scarcity. It also provided seeds to farmers which contributes to alleviating hunger and starvation there. Their women's project sewed masks and our funds also kick-started their eduction efforts for children. The WH 410 Bridge Day in April 2021 raised \$2,955 to use for pastor training in Jeanton and two other communities.

For His Children Ecuador (FHC)

West Hills work with FHC brought His kingdom near in these ways:

• In 2O2O, 58 children were cared for, 9 national and 2 international adoptions were completed, and 2 family reunifications were accomplished.

• During COVID, 5 babies abandoned in Quito were welcomed to FHC, online learning was provided for the children, and staff lived onsite for 2 weeks at a time.

• Justin (age 8) learned to read and write Braille, Alan (age 8) took his first steps after many years of physical therapy, and Micaela (age 7) joined her forever family through adoption after praying for a family for many years.

Upcoming opportunity!! FHC will be giving West Hills a virtual tour via Zoom on Sunday, Aug 29th at 11:30. This will include getting a tour of the facilities, meeting the staff, interacting with the children, and having a time for prayer. Join in the chapel!

JR* - Navigators

Our own local ambassador to the nations! (*We can't print his name.) The Covid pandemic was definitely a challenge for him, keeping him from his field of work. The Lord had a good plan for him though and brought a wonderful woman into his life. They were married in May and are now seeking the Lord together for their next steps. **Pray for them!**

Local Partners:

Westgate Schools

West Hills provided school supplies and staff gifts last August. At Christmas we adopted families supplying gifts for them and gave cards/cookies to staff. The staff was encouraged several times with meals for either conferences or just to let them know we cared and supported them in this most difficult of years. **Pray for our schools and neighborhood**.

OUT WITH THE OLD, IN WITH THE COOOOL

The new 50 ton air conditioning unit in the sanctuary is up and running!

You may remember the article written by Don Glasgow in the April newsletter about the aging HVAC system and the challenges faced by the facility and grounds ministry team. "Both components were installed in the mid 1980's during the sanctuary addition. The outdoor unit (compressor system) has been plagued with problems for several years resulting in thousands of dollars worth of repairs and maintenance. The outdoor unit, located on a grade (south side of the Gym), has 2 of 4 compressors that are beyond repair. As of January 2020, the refrigerant (R22) used in the system is no longer in production. New equipment can no longer be manufactured with this refrigerant." And in deciding if one or both units should be replaced Don said, "The age and condition of the sanctuary AC unit justifies the need to upgrade the entire system". "New equipment will improve the efficiency of the system, save operating and maintenance costs, and serve the church well into the future."

This was a major undertaking, at a price tag of approximately \$138,000, we're so thankful to the congregation, staff and volunteers who made this happen. Also, thanks to the Wahldinger Corporation for their excellent service and workmanship. They were great to work with. These new units are sure to keep us cool for the next 25 years!

MOVIE SUGGESTION



"Discarded Things" is an approved, Dove Family Friendly movie for 12+. The story focuses on the life of music professor, Grace Wyatt. A combination of tragedies in Grace's life. including an abusive father and the accidental death of her fiance, leads her to a life of alcohol and drug abuse. When she finally loses her lavish academic life style she
